Notes and Action Items March 18th Meeting

Theme: Finding our role in suicide prevention among military, veterans and their families

- Day 1 focus on Organizations (Audience: organizations serving veterans and their families, mental health professionals, law enforcement, faith, social workers, employers, more)
- Day 2: focus on Education (Audience: Districts, schools)

Action Item: Review the suggested Veteran Program

- We discussed that the program is a little full right now, but could not determine any part of the program we wanted to eliminate.
- Mike and/or Greg: We discussed inviting Dr. Greg Brown (Safety Plan) and the
 possibility that he could also speak on the second day to education. But we also felt
 strongly about Mike Arnestas (Means Restriction). It was suggested to explore cost and
 availability to invite both and shift/combine some other presentations.
- Nina has reached to the LA Chapter of TAPS, which offers bereavement support for military families after a suicide.

Action Item: Provide suggestions for Education-focused program

For now we are gathering ideas for cutting-edge, relevant and inspirational speakers that can support school-based suicide prevention efforts. As a next step we will need to consolidate ideas into a cohesive program.
