Objective 1.2. By the end of the 2024/2025 school year, a minimum of 25% of schools implement at least one effective program or strategy intended to reduce risk and strengthen protective factors suitable to meet the needs of their student body.

Implementing Policy Change: Suicide Prevention, Intervention and Postvention

All trainings are intended for district staff responsible for decision-making and implementing suicide prevention efforts at the district level.

Framework for Suicide Prevention: Putting Policy Into Practice.
